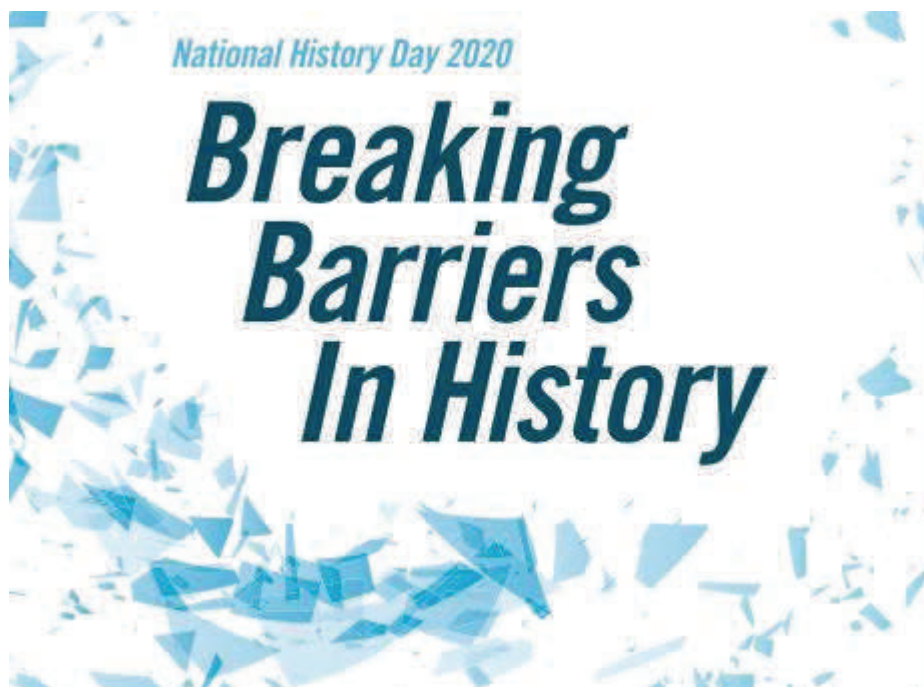



- Students: Bring 3 copies of your Annotated Bibliography + Process Paper

### **Documentaries:**

- Open to the public\*
- Students: Bring 5 copies of your Process paper + Annotated Bibliography
- *Highly Recommended: test your documentary between 7:30am and 8:30am!*

### **Junior and Senior Individual Doc., Junior and Senior Group Doc., and**

**Junior Individual Perf. Students:** there will be a LIVE final round in your event. Final Round finalists will be announced at the Information Desk. If you are a final round finalist, **YOU** (or at least 1 of your group members) must be present to play your documentary. There will not be an interview in final rounds.

**\*We ask that you do not enter or exit a room while a film or performance is underway. Judges should open the door during the interviews and setup/takedown; during this time, you can quietly exit and enter.**
